OCTOBER 50/50 WINNER:

Congratulations to Bruce Smith of York, PA, for being the first to submit a correct answer to the October 50/50 Challenge Question. Pictured was Lt. Col. Jacqueline Cochran. Jackie Cochran rose from humble beginnings to become a legend in aviation history. She was fundamental in the formation of the WAAC (Women's Auxiliary Army Corps) and WASP (Women Airforce Service Pilots) programs. She worked with Amelia Earhart to open the Bendix race to women. She was the first woman to exceed Mach 1, and the first to exceed Mach 2. She was the first woman to fly a fixed wing jet across the Atlantic and to land on an aircraft carrier. She set several other aeronautical records and was inducted into both the National Aviation Hall of Fame and the International Aerospace Hall of Fame.
